Friends, I want to share some important information with you. The residents of Ohio are being asked to sign a petition that would put a measure on the ballot in November. If passed, this amendment would abolish property taxes. At first, this sounds like the greatest idea since sliced bread. But, when we dive a little deeper, we understand the major impact this will have on many, including the most vulnerable.

Data that I pulled from the Ohio Department of Aging shows that in rural Ohio nearly one in three residents is aged 60 or older. That's WCCOA's targeted clientele. In 2025, WCCOA provided over 38,000 meals to seniors in Wyandot County. Our drivers traveled over 200,000 miles, taking seniors to medical appointments and other essential stops. Our homemakers worked close to 4,000 hours keeping our seniors' homes clean and safe.

WCCOA receives 75-80% of our operating budget from levies on property taxes. These levies have been supported every single time they were proposed, and by large margins. The taxpayers of this county have literally voted for increases in their property taxes so that we can provide services to the aging population of this county.

The thought of having to deny food, transportation, or any service to a vulnerable senior keeps me up at night. On the next page, you will find more information to consider when making your decision to support or abandon property taxes in Ohio.

Community Spotlight:

The Vital Role of Local Property Taxes

Property taxes are more than just a line on a bill; they are the backbone of Wyandot County. A proposed amendment to abolish these taxes would defund the local services our residents rely on most.

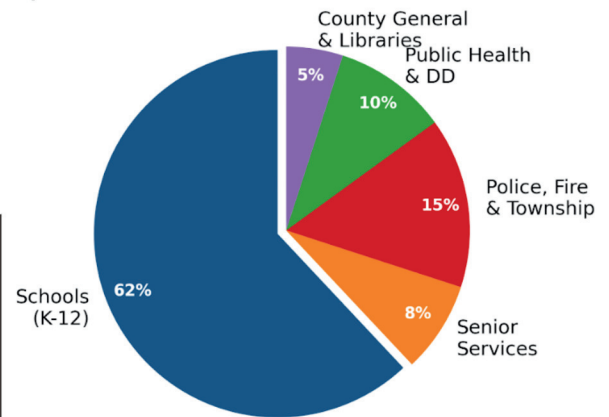
Protecting Our Independence: Senior Services

For many of our neighbors, property tax levies are the difference between living at home and moving into a nursing facility.

- **Vital Programs:** Levies fund home-delivered meals, in-home care, and senior center budgets.
- **Medicaid Prevention:** Over 90% of older Ohioans are not eligible for Medicaid. Senior levies provide the practical support needed to avoid high-cost systems for as long as possible.
- **The Risk:** Eliminating property tax puts these programs at immediate risk of closure, potentially forcing seniors into higher-cost Medicaid systems sooner.

Where the Money Stays:

Unlike other taxes that go to Columbus or Washington, property tax is **locally controlled**. Voters decide how much to spend on:



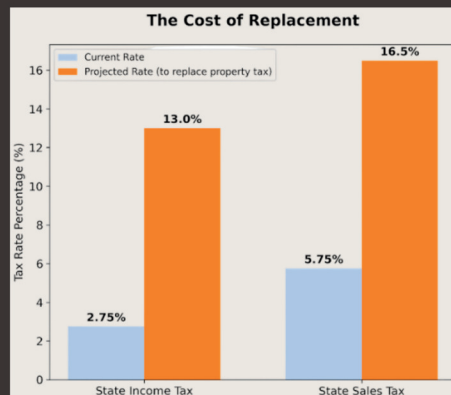
The "Tax Swap": What Would Replace It?

To make up for the \$24 billion loss statewide, other taxes would have to skyrocket to levels never seen in the U.S.:

Projected "Replacement" Rate

State Income Tax
2.75% 11% – 15%
(A 4x Increase)

State Sales Tax 5.75%
15% – 18%
(Highest in the Nation)



- **Local Schools:** Roughly 60% of your property tax supports our children's education and building maintenance.
- **Public Safety:** Police, Fire, and EMS rely on these funds. Without them, response times in our townships would likely slow as stations face layoffs or closures.
- **Stability:** Property taxes are steady. Income and sales taxes "swing sharply" during bad economies, leaving services vulnerable right when people need them most.

The Bottom Line:

Abolishing property taxes isn't just a tax cut; it's a transfer of power. We would lose local control over our community's priorities, and the financial burden would shift to massive hikes in what we pay at the grocery store and on our paychecks.

WHAT IS SARA?

Established by WCCOA in 2025, SARA was created as a strategic extension of the Council's existing services. The program serves as a critical safety net for seniors facing short-term "shocks" to their budget—those sudden, unplanned expenses that can threaten a senior's independence, safety, or ability to remain in their home.

While the Council On Aging provides vital daily services, SARA is our "Rapid Response" fund. It is designed specifically for Wyandot County residents age 60+ who are facing short-term financial burdens that threaten their independence.

Is this a loan?

No. SARA is community-funded relief, designed to help, not add debt.

Is it confidential?

Absolutely. Your privacy and dignity are our highest priorities.

Funds are distributed on a case-by-case basis following an eligibility review and are subject to availability. To maintain the highest level of personalized service and privacy, applications for the SARA program must be picked up in person at the Wyandot County Council On Aging office.

HOW SARA HELPS:



Utility Assistance: Helping seniors keep essential services like heat, water, and electricity running.



Home Repairs: Addressing urgent maintenance issues that impact the safety of the residence.



Vehicle Repairs: Ensuring seniors have reliable transportation for medical appointments and daily needs.



Emergency Situations: Providing flexible support for unique, short-term hardships.
